

Montessori Integrated School is a true Montessori school and one of the pioneers in Montessori Education in the Philippines. It welcomes children from the Preschool level until the High School and Senior High School level. It can also accommodate pupils with special educational needs and who can eventually be integrated into the regular school system.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS



PRESCHOOL AND KINDER

Our Preschool and Kinder students are taught under one roof, which is called The Children's House, but at the same time have separate programs designed for their age group. Teachers assist the interaction between child and environment through carefully chosen and personalized activities. This interaction includes socializing with other 2.5 to 6-year old children. Here, they learn concepts like order, coordinated movement, language, math, and independent functioning and skills.



ELEMENTARY

Elementary education at Montessori emphasizes independent schoolwork to instill self-reliance and responsible freedom in the child. Classes are conducted in mixed-age groupings of 6- to 9-year olds, and 9- to 12-year olds, although lessons are presented in small groups and cover a broad scope. Academic and non-academic activities encourage the child to explore outside the classroom.



JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

The High School Program continues to instill in the pupils the sense of responsible freedom learned during their elementary years. At the same time, they are trained to become responsible, self-reliant, mature, adaptable and global citizens. Young adults have a bigger need to discover for themselves and have direct experiences. The full academic program focuses on the young adults' reasoning and creativity, while interest-based clubs and a work-study program fulfills their need for creative self-expression and societal acceptance, and at the same time teaches them independence, improves their communication and interpersonal skills, and helps them discover their future careers.



SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Montessori Integrated School has several options for Senior High School education. In this way, the young adult develops skills that are suited to his interests, and his training will be custom-fitted to the one that best prepares him for all areas of study and life. Montessori Integrated School will teach the subjects of Senior High School following the curriculum guides of the Department of Education, while specialized institutional partners will handle the student's chosen tracks.



SPECIAL EDUCATION

Our Special Education Program (SPED) concentrates on 3- to 10-year olds with special educational needs, and develops the functional and academic skills they need to live a full life. We aim to integrate pupils with special needs into the regular school system, and eventually into the community. We offer a special class in the preschool level, and mainstreaming in the Preschool, Elementary and High School levels. We offer special support for Elementary and High School students with special educational needs.
