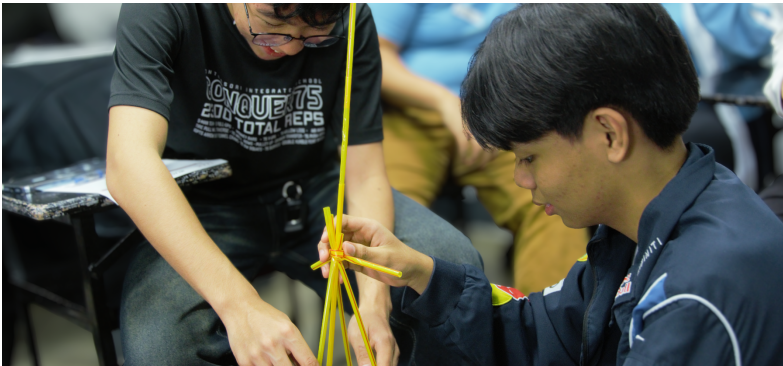

Interactive games followed, including a lively guessing challenge where four groups competed by drawing, acting, or mimicking words. After a short break, students filled out a format sheet listing their interests, skills, and advocacies—then matched these with potential career paths. This activity encouraged self-reflection and opened doors to possibilities they hadn’t considered before.

The final challenge was a hands-on team activity: building the tallest and strongest tower using only straws. It was a test of creativity, collaboration, and resilience.

As the final straw towers stood tall—some wobbly, some sturdy—so did the dreams of every Grade 10 student who joined the workshop.
